



NetLibrary eBooks

Quick Start Guide

NetLibrary ebooks are a collection of more than 12,000 non-fiction titles that:

- Are not available for downloading,
- Must be viewed on a PC while connected to the Internet,
- Do not require a special reader,
- You must have an account to access when not in the Library,
- Are available for viewing without check-out

Creating a NetLibrary Account:

Before you can access NetLibrary remotely (outside the Library), you need to set up an account on one of the computers in the Library. This may be done when your search of our catalog returns a title from NetLibrary. By clicking on the hotlink in the catalog record, you will be redirected to the NetLibrary record for that book. Or, go to www.NetLibrary.com.

- Click on the Create a Free Account link in the upper right-hand corner of the page.
- Complete the required fields of the form. Create a username and password; other than your name, no personal information is required. Your e-mail address is necessary so that your password can be mailed to you should you forget it.
- Once your account is created, you may access NetLibrary ebooks from any Internet-connected computer.

Selecting NetLibrary eBooks:

From our online catalog, search for NetLibrary in the author field for a list of ebook titles.

Or, go directly to www.NetLibrary.com and do a basic search (keyword, title, author, full text). Using the advanced search feature offers more selecting and limiting options.

Special Features:

Viewing - When you find an ebook you'd like to read, click on the **View this ebook** link. If you are actively looking at an ebook, it will be yours for as long as you're using it. If you go 15 minutes without clicking on a link or moving through pages, the book goes back to the pool for another patron to view.

If you click on a title while someone else is viewing it, you will see the following message:

We're sorry, your library's copies of this eContent are currently in use.

Either try again later or use one of the options below.

Request to be notified when this title becomes available

Printing or copying - This is permissible on a limited basis. Highlight the desired text to print using your browser's print function or copy and paste into another document. You will receive an error message from NetLibrary when you have reached the limit of text you are allowed to copy or print.
