



What is the World Cinema collection?

- A collection of foreign language films on DVD shared by Baldwin Public Library, Farmington Community Library, Rochester Hills Public Library, and West Bloomfield Township Public Library. Each of the 4 collections is made up of multiple languages and unique titles.

Where is Baldwin's collection?

- On the media wall just to the left of the NEW DVDs under a sign marked World Cinema. DVDs are arranged alphabetically by language then by title.

Which languages are represented?

- Approximately 35 languages starting with Arabic and ending with Urdu.

How can I find them on the catalog?

- Use the subject heading World Cinema for the entire collection or a phrase, such as Polish films to find what we own in a particular language.

Who can check them out from BPL?

- Anyone with borrowing privileges at Baldwin.

How long can I keep them?

- They check out for one week, with renewals if there are no holds.

What about the DVDs at the other libraries, can I borrow them?

- If you live or work in Birmingham, Beverly Hills, or Bingham Farms and have a Baldwin library card you may ask an Adult Services librarian to request titles from the other participating libraries. If that particular title is currently on the shelf we will notify you when it arrives.

How long can I keep the DVDs from the other libraries?

- These DVDs check out for one week only. You cannot renew them.

Will this collection grow?

- Yes, each of the 4 participating libraries is committed to increasing their World Cinema collection. Plus, after one year the collections will rotate among the libraries giving each library a new collection of World Cinema titles.
