


Early literacy begins with you and your child. Help your child get ready to read by doing simple activities every day.

Pay attention to the pictures on the sides of the pages.	3 Trace your child's hand, keeping fingers together, to make a mitten shape. Have your child color the mitten.	4 Sing "Twinkle, Twinkle Little Star." Look for stars in the sky tonight!	5 Crumple some paper balls and play catch with "snowballs!"
6 Lay on your stomach and pretend to fly!	7 Share a new bedtime story.	8 Spread shaving cream on the shower wall and have your child write letters in it.	9 Tell your child a story about their grandparents.	10 Sing the alphabet song while washing your hands.	11 Have your child dictate a story to you while you write it down.	12 Use toys or socks and put on a "puppet" show.

What can you spot? Snow? Birds?	17 Read "A Chubby Little Snowman" fingerplay and do the motions together. (words on back)	18 Be a letter detective and find certain letters in a book or a newspaper ad.	19 Sing "Jingle Bells" together. Find something to shake and make noise while you sing! (lyrics on back)
20 Play with alphabet refrigerator magnets.	21 Sing "If You're Happy and You Know It" with motions. (lyrics on back)	22 Build a fort with blankets or sheets and have fun inside!	23 Talk about how some trees are decorated outside. Do you like lights on trees?	24 Talk to your child about how your family celebrates events/holidays.	25 Play with an empty box! What can you make or do with it?	26 Have some quiet reading time today.

Spread shaving cream on the shower wall and have child write letters in it.


IF YOU'RE HAPPY AND YOU KNOW IT

Trace around child's hand, keeping fingers together, to make a mitten shape. Have child color the mitten.




Read "The Mitten" by Jan Brett. Pay attention to the pictures on the sides of the pages.
